## Field Activity Advisory Spring-Run Chinook Salmon Yearling Releases December 6, 2018

Approximately 5,200 spring-run Chinook salmon yearlings will be released to the San Joaquin River as part of the reintroduction strategy for the San Joaquin River Restoration Program. These Brood Year (BY) 2016 yearlings will be released to the San Joaquin River in Restoration Reach 5 near State Highway 140. Fish will be transported from the SJRRP interim Salmon Conservation and Research Facility (Interim Facility) near Friant, CA.

**Who:** California Department of Fish and Wildlife.

**What:** Each fish is adipose fin-clipped and fitted with a coded-wire tag. The release group will have a unique tag code to identify them as yearlings originating from the San Joaquin River. The fish will be transported from the Interim Facility to the release site in a flatbed-mounted tank and tempered to river water temperatures onsite.

**Where:** The fish will be released in the San Joaquin River, near the State Highway 140 crossing, and upstream of the confluence with the Merced River. The fish release site will be accessed in coordination with private landowners.

**When:** December 6, 2018
