

## October 20, 2010 SJRRP Water Year 2011 Interim Flows Interim Flows Increase November 1, 2010

On October 1, 2010, the San Joaquin River Restoration Program continued the Interim Flow releases out of Friant Dam at 350 cubic feet per second (cfs). This started the second year of Interim Flow releases that are providing valuable information regarding temperature, fish needs, seepage losses, groundwater conditions and recapture and reuse conditions. Starting on November 1, the flows are scheduled to increase to 700 cfs for at least 10 days. Below is a tentative schedule for the 2011 Interim Flows. You can check the website for regular updates to this information as the amounts will change based on hydrology conditions and coordination with the Settling Parties and the Restoration Administrator.

A Draft Annual Technical Report for spring 2010 is available on the website in the <u>Program Documents</u> section if you are interested on more information regarding the monitoring and analyses that have been conducted on the Interim Flow releases.

Note: The release schedule for flows is subject to change based on hydrology conditions as the water year progresses and coordination with the Settling Parties and the Restoration Administrator. If necessary, additional releases will be made for flood management that could exceed the anticipated Interim Flow releases.
