

Dear Landowner: Receipt of this Field Activity Advisory means that property you own or is owned by others near you may be visited by staff of the California State Lands Commission. The purpose of this advisory is to inform you of this pending activity and who to contact if you have any questions as they relate to the commission's statutory responsibility to identify sovereign lands of the State of California on sections of the San Joaquin River.

Field Activity Advisory California State Lands Commission Verification Survey December 10, 2012

California State Lands Commission (CSLC) staff will conduct site visits along the right and left bank of Reaches 3 and 4A as part of activities to complete mapping of San Joaquin River lands sovereign to the State of California. The site visits are weather-dependent and currently scheduled to occur December 10-14, 2012. The purpose of the site visit is to compare and verify the accuracy of the high water line contained in draft administrative plat maps with existing river conditions. The activity will include staff driving along canal levees and private river levees, with periodic stops along the river to record coordinates. Travel along canal levees and private levees is being conducted in coordination with Central California Irrigation District, Columbia Canal Company, and riverside landowners.
